42,140 dental sealants

In fiscal year '18-19 ending June 30, the Department of Health in Volusia County (DOH-Volusia) provided more than 42,140 dental sealants to Volusia County children in school settings. Every \$1 spent on dental sealants saves \$2.38 in fillings by preventing decay. The department's two school-based teams provide dental cleanings and dental sealants, if needed, fluoride treatments and dental hygiene supplies.



Improving access to services for clients

DOH-Volusia has improved access to services for clients by opening its doors to Volusia County Veterans Services and Human Services at the three DOH-Volusia locations. By co-locating DOH and County offices, the move enhances access to health services for Veterans and Human Services clients. The agency also is moving a large portion of its WIC, clinical and HIV services to a location in the heart of a Daytona Beach neighborhood that experiences poor health outcomes. Construction is wrapping up at the new Keech Street location to enable staff to start seeing clients in early 2020.

PrEP program gains momentum

Since DOH-Volusia began offering pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) for the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV) in late 2018, more than two dozen clients have enrolled in the program. PrEP is a once-daily pill that can reduce the chance of acquiring HIV in HIV-negative individuals. HIV is the virus that causes Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS).




Community Health Needs Assessment

DOH-Volusia took a leading role in developing the Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) for Volusia County. The agency worked collaboratively with governmental and nongovernmental partners, including Volusia County Government, AdventHealth, and Halifax Health. The 2019 CHNA is serving as the basis for the Community Health Improvement Plan to identify and implement strategies for action and establish accountability to ensure measurable improvement.
