The Dover Lane Subdivision Public Water System will NOT be re-permitted as a drinking water provider. All who are connected to, and receive water from that source will need to obtain another approved drinking water source.

All those who are using permitted *irrigation* wells and any non-permitted well water source must have their wells inspected by the Health Department and must apply for a potable water well permit. Variances, if applicable, will be discussed with you. You are urged to voluntarily upgrade your well to a private potable well.
