	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Group Discussion</u></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Concerns / Topics to focus on<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Ability to do effective prevention with the rules and guidelines that the DOH has to abide by. There are methods that are proven to have better results but those have been phased out.- Once the prevention module went to the Prevention for Positives we saw a spike in new cases.- We need to do more community outreach.- People don't remember AIDS in the 80's. They don't think about it anymore and when they do no one wants to talk about it.- Young people who are at high risk are thinking of HIV/AIDS like a blood pressure issue; they're probably going to get it but can just take medication and it will be ok.- We need to focus on the younger people. They are having multiple partners by the time they even come in to get tested the first time.• Ideas / Suggestions<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Bring back testing blitzes in new and different locations like community centers or festivals.- Look into the Teen Outreach Program (TOP). This is a grant based program that offers education on risky behaviors to at risk youths. (I have sent an email to them asking for more information)- Create a science-based HIV/AIDS curriculum that the schools may approve.- Get rid of whatever is not working, think outside the box and start coming up with new ideas for outreach and prevention.- Miami has been given permission to do a needle exchange. It will be a five-year pilot program and all the funds have to be raised by the program itself. Our community would benefit greatly from a program like this.- In other states they are allowed to pass out "bleach kits". We are not allowed to but perhaps we can fill the bags with everything that we are allowed to put in and hand them over to a group who is allowed to add in the bleach and whatever else is needed. Also, we could make it a goal to change the rule that prevents us from handing out bleach kits.
