Updates PPG, PCPG, Ryan White	<p>Laverne Bell and Omar Mayes gave updates on the Patient Care and Prevention Planning Group meetings (PPG, PCPG), respectively. Other attendees also remarked. Highlights:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • HIV testing “Opt Out” bill passed the Florida House and Senate unanimously. • A make-up Prevention town hall will take place in Volusia • There is new leadership in the State’s Prevention and Patient Care areas • Florida is now number 1 in “new” HIV diagnoses • Volusia is part of the new Hep C trial program <p>Dawn Pietrewicz briefly updated members on Ryan White 14-15 which is currently being finalized. More details available in June. She also covered the last 6 months of planning activity that lead up to today’s workshop. This activity culminated in 4 prioritized planning focus areas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - #1 Retention in Care (continuum of care) - #2 Motivating Clients to Better self care - #3 (tie) Client Health Literacy, Increased Peer Activity/Coordination and Reducing Transportation Barriers 	
Groundwork	<p>Dawn Pietrewicz provided foundational information on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • How the Area 12 Ryan White program was currently addressing the 4 areas. • Highlights of the CDC/HRSA Integrated HIV Statewide Coordinated Statement of Need/Prevention and Care Plan (2017-2021) Guidance Outline (Stakeholder Input version) from PCPG that might impact PCHAP planning. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The HIV Care Continuum should be utilized - Plans should focus on addressing the National HIV/AIDS Strategy - Collaborations, Partnerships & Stakeholder involvement is important • The varying states of consumer engagement in the HIV Continuum of Care • A decision making matrix for Health Literacy & Motivating Clients to Better Self-care. 	
Brainstorming	After a creativity exercise, the members brainstormed ideas surrounding the 4 planning focus areas. During this exercise no ideas or thoughts are rejected or discouraged.	

Assessment	The members reviewed the results of the brainstorming exercise. Grouped similar items, eliminated responses that did not fit into the consortia's purview and voted on the remaining items. The resulting ideas will be presented at the June PCHAP meeting.
