Any members who turned their original application in to the Health Planning Council will need to submit a new application to the Department of Health.</li> </ul>
	<u>Topics</u>	<ul> <li>Lead Agency Update: <ul> <li>The end of the grant year is coming up and they are working to get invoices and budgets settled.</li> <li>Approval was received to order food coupons from GThankyou. They have been received and are being distributed. Clients who are retained in care are eligible for \$35 per month. Coupons can only be used for food items, so clients are no longer required to bring back their receipt.</li> <li>Attempts to work out a deal with Lyft was proving to be too expensive. The state is working with Lyft and Uber to create a statewide contract that we will be able to use as an option for transportation.</li> <li>Tenant Based Rental Assistance will be available for use in the next few months.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

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	<ul> <li>PCHAP Flyer:         <ul> <li>The Lead Agency staff is working on creating a flyer that has PCHAP information on one side and grievance policy information on the other side. A text version will be sent out with the March minutes to allow for input from PCHAP members.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Bylaws and Guidelines:         <ul> <li>As a group, we need to revise our bylaws to reflect the changes within the consortium. We can use this as selling point to get new members to join and</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>help create a structure that works for the community.</li> <li>We should keep in mind that last year's survey showed that a lot of members left because they felt the group got too political.</li> <li>The Lead Agency will work on updating the Service Guidelines and bring them to April's meeting have the group vote on whether they will be approved or not.</li> <li>It was decided to start working on the bylaws in June and July of 2018.</li> </ul>
