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Daytona Beach, Fla. — The Florida Department of Health will host the 3D mobile mammography bus, Mammolink, to provide free or low-cost mammograms to women in the community from 8:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., June 19, at the Florida Department of Health located at 1845 Holsonback Dr., Daytona Beach.

To be eligible for a free mammogram screening, you must meet each of the four below criteria:

- 1. Be a women age 40-64.
- 2. Have a household income, less than or equal to 200% of the poverty level.
- 3. Have no health insurance to cover the cost of a clinical breast exam, mammogram, or Pap smear.
- 4. Have primary residency in Florida
